**Illegal waste shipments are a barrier to
recycling and environmentally sound
waste management**

- **Step up implementation and enforcement of the EU waste shipment regulation (1013/2006/EC)**
- **Improve cooperation with Member States**

Stepping up implementation and enforcement of the EU waste shipment regulation (I)

- **New powers for inspectors: reversing the burden of proof (Reg. 660/2014)**
- **Inspection plans: a compulsory requirement for Member States from 1/1/17**
- **Risk assessment: target waste streams identify sources of illegal shipments**

Stepping up implementation and enforcement of the EU waste shipment regulation (II)

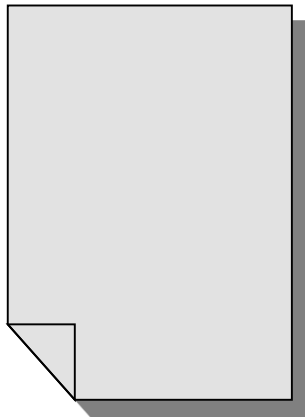
- **Waste and customs codes: correlation table**
- **Electronic data inter-change**

Better cooperation

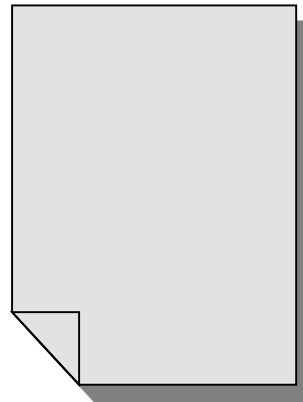
- **Waste shipment correspondents: MS-COM-stakeholders**

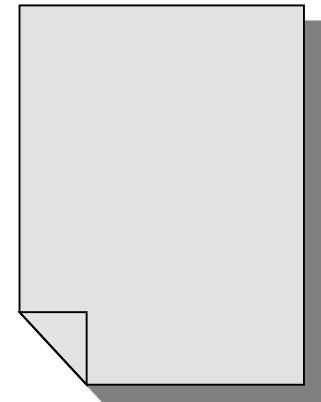
